Since 1941, Arizona has developed Registered Apprenticeship programs across various industries, helping employers create a skilled workforce and providing apprentices with paid employment to learn sustainable trades.

What is a Registered Apprenticeship?

A Registered Apprenticeship is an industry-driven, high-quality career pathway where employers can develop and prepare their future workforce, and individuals can obtain paid work experience and receive progressive wage increases; classroom instruction; and a portable, nationally recognized credential.

The length of a Registered Apprenticeship program can vary depending on the complexity of the occupation, employer, industry, and the type of program.

A Registered Apprenticeship is different from other types of workplace training programs in several ways:

- Industry Led Programs are industry-vetted and approved to ensure alignment with industry standards and that apprentices are trained for highly skilled, high-demand occupations.
- **Paid Job** Registered Apprenticeships are jobs! Apprentices earn progressive wages as their skills and productivity increase.
- Structured On-the-Job Learning Structured on-the-job training is provided by an experienced mentor.
- **Supplemental Education** Apprentices receive classroom education tailored to employers' specific training needs to ensure quality and success.
- **Diversity** Programs are designed to reflect their communities through strong nondiscrimination and anti-harassment recruitment practices to ensure access, equity, and inclusion.
- Quality & Safety Under rigorous training, apprentices receive worker protections to ensure their safety.
- Credentials Apprentices earn a portable, nationally recognized credential within their industry.

In Arizona, registered apprentices who complete their programs earn over \$64,000 annually upon completion.
